



Quarter Horse Ship-In Training

Effective May 23, 2017 all racing, training and stabled Quarter Horses are required to have a negative Equine Piroplasmiasis test in order to enter the grounds at Indiana Grand Racing and Casino. To enter the premises, the test must have been conducted within six (6) months immediately prior to entering. The animals must be tested for the Theileria equi strain of equine piroplasmiasis using a C-ELISA assay. Each animal must be accompanied by a copy of the official laboratory test results (in addition to all other Indiana Grand Health Requirements) that contains the following:

- 1 The identification of the animal.
- 2 The date the blood sample was drawn.
- 3 The negative equine piroplasmiasis test.

All quarter horses shipping in to train will be identified and must train out of the receiving barn

There will be no ship-in training to trainers with stalls on the grounds

In addition to the above mentioned piroplasmiasis test, each horse must present proper paperwork to the stable gate;

- a. Each time a horse enters the grounds, trainers are required to show, at the stable gate a current negative Coggins test in the past 12 months.
- b. A Health Certificate issued within 30 days of entry and out of state horses must present a Health Certificate issued within 72 hours of date of entry.
- c. All Health Certificates require a statement of Equine Herpes Vaccination (EHV-1) and date, administered a minimum of 14 days and no more than 180 days prior to entering the stable area.
- d. *If foal certificates are not on file in the racing office, the foal certificates must accompany the animal*
- e. Prior to departure, all horses must have a signed release form confirming the horse was identified
